Message From the Assembly Chair Gerard J. Criner, MD

I would like to update you on Clinical Problems Assembly activities that have occurred over the past year and updated plans for program improvements over the next year. These activities have been centered on the principle of better serving the CP Assembly members by engaging more members at various levels of training, experience and geographic location into the planning and development of CP educational activities.

Specifically, the development of concentrated efforts to improve the educational content of the CP website, expand international member participation, enhance young physicians and trainee participation and facilitate the development of translational planning and international meeting projects and presentations is currently underway. Below are brief updates of website, international meeting and planning committee activities of the Assembly over the past year

Clinical Problems Assembly Website Victor Kim, MD, Web Director

The CP Assembly Website has published their first survey of their members. This survey is meant to identify what topics and problems would be most useful for future ATS projects. The results of the first survey have been published online. All members are encouraged to take the survey to guide the planning process for future proposals for CP Assembly projects.

A Website Subcommittee has been formed, with the goals of enhancing the CP Assembly Website. This subcommittee will develop and execute new plans for improving the appeal and utility of the website to the clinicians, scientists, and doctors in training that comprise our assembly membership. The CP Assembly Website Subcommittee members have worked hard to maintain a high standard for the ATS Clinical Cases, a monthly clinical case in an interactive format, designed to provide education to practitioners, faculty, fellows, residents, and medical students in the areas of pulmonary, critical care and sleep medicine. A PDA application of the BODE index is being developed with the aid of Tom Stibolt. Future PDA programs include Lung Allocation Score and SPN malignancy prediction calculators.

The Website continues to be a source for Assembly news, CP Assembly projects in progress, current CP Assembly ATS statements, awards, and links to the state of the art series in the American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine, the fellows reading list, and patient education materials.

The Clinical Problems (CP) Assembly Planning Committee has received funding for 8 projects this year. Overall funding for CP assembly projects has increased despite increased competition and difficult financial times. The planning committee also implemented new procedures to help make submitting projects easier, more streamlined, and more competitive. For the first time last year, each application received input from the guideline and development staff at ATS prior to submission.
