The National Faculty Education Initiative was developed by the Alliance for Continuing Medical Education (Alliance) and the Society for Academic Continuing Medical Education (SACME), in collaboration with the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC).

The goal of the Initiative is to help medical education faculty understand the differences between certified CME activities and commercial marketing/ promotional programs. The Initiative consists of two components:

>>> Online Educational Activity

The online educational activity uses case-based content to quickly and efficiently educate medical education faculty about federal regulations, accreditation and professional standards, and their roles and responsibilities when presenting in certified CME or commercial programs. Those who complete the activity have their names added to the verification database.

>>> Verification Database

The verification database is designed for CME providers and commercial interests providing promotional activities, so that they may verify that faculty educators they plan to invite are knowledgeable of the multiple sets of rules that govern speaker accountability when presenting in each environment.

The online educational activity is available free of charge to medical education faculty.
