



Author Disclosures

The American Thoracic Society (ATS) is pleased to make *Career Talk: The Book* available as an online resource for ATS members. Although this publication was not planned and produced explicitly as a continuing medical education (CME) activity, and the ATS is not awarding CME credit for its use, it is ATS practice that all ATS medical education programs and publications:

- conform to disclosure standards of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) and American Medical Association (AMA) to ensure balance, independence, objectivity and scientific rigor in planning and presentation;
- disclose to learners any discussion of “off-label” use of substances/products not approved in the United States for the use under discussion.

Therefore, the ATS required that the following be disclosed by authors of this publication:

1. Disclosure of “relationships with a commercial interest if both (a) the relationship is financial and occurred within the past 12 months, and (b) the individual has the opportunity to affect the content [of ATS educational programs and publications] about the products or services of that commercial interest.
 - The ACCME defines “financial relationships” as those relationships in which the individual benefits by receiving a salary, royalty, intellectual property rights, consulting fee, honoraria, ownership interest (e.g. stocks, stock options or other ownership interest, excluding diversified mutual funds) or other financial benefit. Financial benefits are usually associated with roles such as employment, management position, independent contractor (including contracted research), consulting, speaking and teaching, membership on advisory committees or review panels, board membership, and other activities for which remuneration is received or expected. ACCME considers relationships of the person involved in the [educational] activity to include financial relationships of a spouse or partner. The ACCME has not set a minimum dollar amount for relationships to be significant. Inherent in any amount is the incentive to maintain or increase the value of the relationship.” (*ACCME Questions and Answers Regarding the 2004 Updated Standards for Commercial Support, 10/20/04*)
 - The ACCME defines “commercial interests” as “any proprietary entity producing health care goods or services consumed by, or used on, patients”, with the exception of non profit or government organizations and non-health care related companies. The following are not considered “commercial interests”: for profit hospitals, rehabilitation centers and nursing homes; liability insurance providers, health insurance providers, group medical practices.
2. Disclosure of any discussion in the presentation of “off-label” (unapproved) use of substances/products not approved in the United States for the use under discussion.
