The ATS Nursing Assembly Early Career Achievement Award will be given to a Nursing Assembly member (primary or secondary assembly member) who has made outstanding contributions relevant to nursing in the area(s) of research, clinical care, teaching, and/or service. This person shows commitment and support of the Nursing Assembly and ATS. The award recognizes individuals who have made valuable contributions focused on patient and family responses related to pulmonary conditions, critical illness, or sleep disorders early in his or her career. The awardee will be presented with a framed certificate at the annual Nursing Assembly meeting during the ATS International Conference.

Our Mission and Vision Statement

The ATS Nursing Assembly is committed to fostering an international pulmonary nursing network dedicated to building the scientific foundation for nursing practice that is translated and implemented to deliver patient-centered, interprofessional care for people affected by pulmonary, critical care or sleep-related conditions across the lifespan and care settings.

What are our areas of Research and Practice?

Assembly participation is the primary mechanism by which

- Preventing disease and disability related to pulmonary, critical care and sleep-related conditions
- Improving management of symptoms resulting from and associated with pulmonary, critical care or sleep-related conditions
- Enhancing end-of-life and palliative care
- Nursing education and professional training programs related to the management of persons with lung diseases.
- Education and training in the definition and evaluation of pulmonary patient outcomes

Why participate in the Nursing Assembly?

Assembly participation is the primary mechanism by which ATS members become involved in the ATS. Assembly participation allows members to experience the ATS on a smaller and more manageable scale and to meet like-minded people. The Nursing Assembly in collaboration with other Assemblies are responsible for Programming the annual International Conference, developing and updating ATS Official Documents along with serving on interprofessional working groups and committees.

The following are some specific advantages for clinicians, predoctoral, postdoctoral trainees and junior faculty to actively participate in the Nursing Assembly:

- Access and interact with academic and clinical Nursing leaders in the fields of pulmonary, critical care and sleep-related conditions through assembly activities, leadership, and collaborative projects.
- Share common or similar interests, with opportunities to engage in projects across research disciplines, disease management pathways, and training backgrounds.
- Become acquainted with your colleagues as an important part of establishing a successful career. The annual Nursing Assembly Membership Meeting is a dedicated time for interacting with your friends and peers along with hearing about what is happening in the fields of pulmonary, critical care and sleep-related Nursing as they relate to research and practice.
- Opportunities at the International Conference to chair symposia or mini-symposia and/or facilitate poster discussions or thematic poster sessions.
